# NIA nabs pro-Khalistan terror accused in Delhi

New Delhi: National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Tuesday arrested an alleged pro-Khalistan terror accused Gurbaj Singh Nijjar who had been hiding in Cyber, in the Indian Capital International Airport, reports Bharti Jindal.

Nijjar was an absconding accused in the Pune Khalistan case, which has its origins in the arrest of an accused Harpal Singh in Pune by Maharashtra ATS on December 2, 2018, with an illegal firearm and some live rounds. Harpal has links with pro-seceded terrorist outfit Babbar Khalsa International (BKI), said a source. Subsequently another accused - Min Khan - was arrested by Punjab Police from Sialkot and has custody taken by Mumbai Police on December 24, 2018.
